Learning Environment:

History

- Exploring religious festivals and their associated traditions.
- Thinking about Easter and its importance to Christians.

- Exploring digital mapping •

- Our own preferences.

English- In addition to ensuring handwriting is accurately joined and correctly sized, grammar features and punctuation are considered and used; we will be reading and writing the following text types

- Poetry based The Sea by James Reeves.
- Story writing with personification, scene and character descriptions.
- Persuasive writing.
- Research and presentation.

Geography - linked to our topic Blue Abyss
