Curriculum:

RE - We will be exploring the question: 'How should we care for others and the world, and why does it matter?'

Science - This term we are learning about plants, exploring how they grow and what they need to survive.

History - We are learning about the progression of flight and how it has developed over time.

DT - In Design and Technology, we will be focusing on construction, designing and building a moon buggy.

Art - Our topic, Colour Splash, explores painting and mixed media, allowing children to experiment creatively with colour.

PE - This half term we will focus on striking and fielding games as well as athletics.

English - We will be studying the story Jack and the Beanstalk, using it to develop our narrative writing skills.

Maths - We will be learning about ten, and the 2 and 5 times tables, as well as using coins. To support this at home, please encourage your child to use money in real-life situations—for example, giving them a few pennies to spend on small items (such as 1p sweets) can really help build their confidence and understanding.
