# Pod Popping Moments

### Acoms Class



Acorns have been learning what 'double' means in lots of different contexts. They have mastered the art of playing dominoes! The children are great at subitising (identifying amounts without counting) now. We have been learning about

how to keep our bodies healthy by eating well, personal hygiene and being active.

# Willow Class



This week in Willow Class for our Science day we investigated what materials will float or sink. We first predicted what would happen to differ-

ent objects and then we tested our predictions by seeing if the objects would float or sink. We wrote about our experiment just like a scientist would with our 'results' and a 'conclusion'.

### Beech Class





Wow! What a lot of science learning. The children have learnt all about electricity and explored its history as far back as 600bc. They have experimented with circuits to find out how to make a bulb light up. They used their learning from earlier in the year around materials to explain why metal allows the electricity to flow. They were then set a challenge to light up a bulb with tin foil, a battery, and a bulb.

# Rowan Class







We had a super day of science on Wednesday with the children using UV reactive beads to test different materials in order to create a safe pair of sunglasses. From hypothesis to conclusion, the children worked as teams to ensure that their test was fair and to record accurate results. Fantastic!





# Birch Class







Birch class have been investigating air resistance and considering changing variables. We enjoyed using our origami skills to create different shapes and analysing how this impacts the air resistance on the paper.

Through comparing how the paper travelled and the speed, we were able to draw conclusions.

# Maple Class



This week, Year 5 have mastered the art of finding missing angles on a straight line, around the point of a circle and in a variety of shapes using bar modelling to support their calculations. Children have now finished the supported stage of their writing and are moving into writing

an independent information text about Tutankhamun. We studied a lot of science this week: investigating forces. One question we asked was - how did the Ancient Egyptians transport sand stone blocks to build pyramids?

# Oak Class



This week we have been completing science experiments liked to our topic - How did the Egyptians build the pyramids? We used Newton meters to pull weights over dry and wet sand before writing up our results! We have also been thinking about the discovery of Tutan-

khamun's tomb. In our writing, we will be imagining we are inside the tomb - writing in the present tense!

# Nursery



The children have loved to help make play dough this week. We explored colour mixing, changing the texture with dry and wet ingredients and explored smell and touch as we added the ingredients. We would really appreciate some
